Salima's Success:

How you set off a life-changing domino effect!

Do you remember Salima?

Around the holidays I introduced you to Salima Nosiku, a mother of two from Zambia. She was struggling to pay rent on her farm supply store and often lay awake at night with worry.

Well, she's been building her business for a few years now, and I've been eagerly waiting to share more of her story with you. She's an AMAZING example of how your support has started a domino effect for even more women like her and their communities.

Because of generous gifts from people like you, Salima was able to take an agriculture training class. iDE also connected her to suppliers of farm seeds and chemicals, which she sells in her store. These products are often difficult to find for farmers in her rural community.

Now for the best part.






Not only is she able to pay rent on her store, but she opened up two additional stores and hired women from her community to work there!

The number of farmers she works with has increased from 1,000 to 5,000. Salima also buys crops - like soya beans, maize and cowpeas - from local farmers who would otherwise struggle traveling long distances to urban centres to sell what they've grown.

Agriculture training is one of iDE's most tried, tested and successful programs. That's why it's a main focus of Her Time to Grow — our project in collaboration with Global Affairs Canada that is creating income opportunities like this for 25,000 women like Salima who are involved in agriculture in Zambia, Ethiopia and Ghana.

iDE country staff are excited and ready to teach the next group of women, thanks to your support! In addition to that, your gifts are making it possible to provide ongoing support to these women as they start using their knowledge and supporting farmers in their communities.

You're creating a safe space to test ideas through the Polak Fund

Have you ever been nervous about trying something new? Did you have a safety-net in place if something didn't go as planned?

Since 2021, your support has been providing a safety-net for innovators and entrepreneurs through iDE's Paul Polak Innovation Fund.

Thanks to your generous donations, the Polak Fund has distributed 50 awards in 11 countries around the world. These awards create a safe space to test ideas for new or improved ways to earn income.

One of these projects, led by Fatima Shehata at the iDE Innovation Lab. is working on a mushroom growing kit for small farmers in Cambodia. Mushrooms are a high-value crop, so growing them is an opportunity for farmers to earn more money. This project has faced challenges, but those challenges have provided learning opportunities as they re-design and continue testing the grow kit.

Fatima says that iDE shouldn't place the risk of failure on farmers whose livelihoods depend on growing mushrooms.

Cycle 5 is the Meindertsma's journey embarking on 5 epic bike rides spanning five continents over five years - all while raising funds for five charities that work towards "cycles of opportunity for the less fortunate through sports, education, or business." iDE is honored to be one of the five charities chosen.

Their first ride, which spanned 4,300 kms from Banff, Alberta to Antelope, New Mexico, lasted 39 days and included 50,000 meters of climbing.

Many women in Zambia, Ethiopia and Ghana noted the challenge of dividing their time between various roles — mother, wife, homemaker, and income earner.

We heard this over and over again in interviews for Her Time to Grow, our project supporting women in agriculture — a project you passionately provided for!

It can be especially hard to balance the roles of income earner and parent when childcare services are unavailable or inaccessible.

That's why one of the solutions these women identified was access to childcare.

Thanks to your support, iDE is currently working to set up safe and nurturing childcare centres, so women can focus on their income-earning work.

Income they can invest back into the lives of their kids through improvements in education, nutrition, housing and hygiene.

These childcare centres can also be used as a gathering place for community meetings and farming demonstrations.

Thank you for working to provide a safe space for kids that helps women balance their roles and improve their families lives!

You are providing the education, tools and resources women in Ethiopia, Ghana and Zambia need to thrive in their agriculture business, through iDE's Her Time to Grow project.

Your support directly impacts 25,000 female entrepreneurs. These women can go on to positively impact an estimated 165,000 more people, including 91,000 youth.
